

## DoGES graduate students attend a joint international inter-university field course

The Department of Geography & Environmental Studies (DoGES), University of Nairobi, in collaboration with the Centre for Development & Environment (CDE), University of Bern, Switzerland, and the Centre for Research in Arid & Semi-Arid Development (CETRAD), Nanyuki, held

a successful inter-university field course on sustainable regional development in Kenya. The field course, which took place between 21<sup>st</sup> and 31<sup>st</sup> of August, 2013, brought together 18 graduate students from various universities in Europe and 18 from the department.

The field course covered the following spatial contexts: semi-arid lowlands (Samburu, Isiolo); semi-arid plateau (Laikipia); semi-humid foot-zone (Nanyuki, Mt. Kenya); high-potential core areas (Karatina); peri-urban agglomeration (Thika-Nairobi); and urban centre (Nairobi). Within that spatial context, the field course covered nine themes, namely, 1) water issues and management; 2) water, gender and marginalized groups; 3) primary production and food security; 4) climate and/or global change; 5) values of nature; 6) poverty and disparities; 7) economic versus service landscapes; 8) governance of sustainable development; and 9) learning for sustainable development.
