

## 2013 Zanzibar Summer School

Dr. Samuel Owuor was one of the facilitators at the 2013 SummerSchool.The 2013 Summer School а methodological training programme in Social Sciences andHumanities (SSH) in East Africa – was held in Zanzibar, Tanzania, from 3rd April to 12<sup>th</sup>April 2013. It was hosted by the State University of Zanzibar (SUZA) in the Stone Town ofZanzibar City. The

Summer School drew its participants from various publicuniversities in East Africa (Kenya, Tanzania, and Uganda). It involved prospective or currentPhD students and, amongst them, (assistant) lecturers and/or junior researchers belonging tothese institutions.

At a institutional level, this scientific event was jointly organized by SUZA(the State University of Zanzibar, based in Zanzibar Town, Tanzania), IFRA (*InstitutFrançais de Recherche en Afrique*), three research units of IRD (*Institut de Recherche pour leDéveloppement*): URMIS ("migration and societies"), PALOC ("local heritages") andCEPED ("population and development") and INED (Institut national d'étudesdémographiques). With a focus on Heritage, the 2013 Summer School provided training in the methods andtechniques of research in SSH in view of enhancing multi-disciplinary perspectives andqualitative approaches. The training was supported financially by the Embassies of France inTanzania, Uganda and Kenya through their services of cultural and scientific cooperation(SCAC), as well as by AIRD (*Agence Inter-établissements de Recherche pour leDéveloppement*), IFRA, IRD, and the Commission for Science and Technology (COSTECH)in Tanzania.

The 2013 training was a continuation of a series of Summer Schools for methodologicalcapacity-building in the field of SSH in Eastern Africa jointly organized by IRD, IFRA andvarious Eastern African institutions of higher education. It was the third edition of its kind, thefirst two were held, in 2006, in Kenya and in 2008 in Tanzania.
