## University of Nairobi scoops awards from the Science and Technology Week

The week long Science and Technology Symposium come to an end today at the Central Catering Unit, University of Nairobi , where various cadre of participants were feted for their exemplary performance in taking science and technology to another level. The event begun on Monday, 11-15, 2015.
