Other panelists included; Chris Muthuri from SOTU Africa, Oscar Muriuki from Danish Refugee Council and Professor Rosemary Otieno, an associate professor at the Institute for Development Studies, University of Nairobi.

As young people who are graduating and venturing into entrepreneurship, the youth were told to expand their networks, avoid procrastinating on their ideas but rather implement them immediately.
