Information Communication and Technology Officers from Office of the Auditor General are being trained on computer forensics at the College of Biological and Physical Sciences, School of Computing and Informatics (SCI). The week long training that began in December 14, 2015, will equip staff members

from Information Technology (IT) and Information Communication and Technology (ICT) departments with tools that will necessitate effective forensic tasks in the organization.

Officially presiding over the training, Dr. Domenic Kamenyi, Director IT, said that the training is important in forensic reporting for investigation purpose.

Among the topics to be covered include: hard disk architecture, analyzing digital evidence such as recovery of deleted files, forensics report, email investigations as well as cellphone forensics including subscriber forensics analyses.



Ms. Mary Mwangi, an Audit Associate (ICT Software and Application) is looking forward to learn new skills. Ms. Mwangi is a **sever administrator** in office Active Directory (AD), Exchange, SharePoint and TeamMate. She says that the course will help her enforce computer and information security by **identify loopholes in the servers** which pose a security threat such as **cybercrime**. It will also enable her to collect and examine logs. In addition, the course will help her to **implement cloud computer forensics** which is being implemented by most organizations through cloud technology. Also, the course will assist her to know the right tools to use in forensic system audit.

SCI also conducted a training in Soft Computer Skills to 300 members of staff from Office of the Auditor General in August 2015.
