PARTICULARS OF TOWN PLANNING SCHEMES IN PROGRESS.

1 - MOMBASA.

(i) The Mombasa Town Planning Scheme, 1926 (enacted under the Town Planning Ordinance, 1919), the Scheme applies to the Island of Mombasa with exception of the Old Town of Mombasa, an unplanned densely built over area of about seventy acres on the eastern shore of the Island at the Old Port of Mombasa. The Scheme consists for the most part of pooling and re-distribution of holdings of land and re-adjustment of boundaries for the purpose of facilitating the provision of adequate roads. The scheme is being carried into effect by the Mombasa Municipal Board as Executive Authority.

The Mombasa Town Planning Scheme, Variation No.1 (Mnazi Moja area) has been approved under the Town Planning Ordinance, 1931, in respect of an area in the vicinity of Ibaraki which had been inadequately dealt with under the original Scheme, and Variation No.2 (Extension of Factory and Warehouse area) has been approved for the extension of the area in which warehouse and factory development may take place and for the provision of a Radio Silence Zone surrounding the Wireless Receiving Station in which factories will not be permitted.

(ii) Mombasa Old Town Improvement Scheme: This Scheme consists of the provision of two 25-ft. traffic thoroughfares through the Old Town. Adjustment of plots and holdings to conform to the new street building alignments is proceeding gradually, as opportunity offers, without further expenditure.

(iii) Mombasa Mainland North (Ikomanj): This Scheme, prepared in accordance with the Town Planning and Development Ordinance, 1931, for the control of development on the Mainland was approved and enacted in April, 1934.

2 - NAIROBI.

(i) Bazaar Area - Little progress was made in the demolition of old buildings affected by the Nairobi Bazaar Area Schemes Nos. 1 and 2 partly owing to difficulties raised by lessees and partly to the wartime difficulty of obtaining building material.

(ii) Duke Street Area - No further action has been taken towards the preparation of a Statutory Town Planning Scheme but certain agreed acquisitions have been completed.

3 - GENERAL.

(i) There have been some small revisions of minor townships.

(ii) A Town Planning Panel was formed consisting of representatives of the Kenya and Uganda Railways and Harbours Administration, the Local Government, Lands and Settlement Department, the Public Works Department, the Medical Department, the Chief Native Commissioner (or his nominee) and representatives of the Nairobi Municipal Council and the Nairobi District Council with the object of advising the Nairobi Town Planning Authority on the planning of the Nairobi Municipality and adjacent areas.

## WEIGHTS AND MEASURES.

The standards of weight and measure provided for use in trade are the Imperial Pound, Yard and Gallon as defined by the Imperial Weights and Measures Act 1878.

The authorised denominations of weights and measures are the same as those in use in Great Britain, but with the exception of the 100 lb. or central weight and the addition of the  $4\frac{1}{2}$  gallon measure (5 American gallons approx).

Metric weights and measures legalised for use in Great Britain by the Weights and Measures (Metric System) Act, 1897, may be legally used in the Colony.

The use of some of the older measures still prevails in the outlying districts, the principal being the pishi, equivalent to 0.65 gallon, the kibabu, equivalent to 26 Fl.oz., the term korja is also in use for a score, used in measuring poles.

The term frasila is still in use as a commercial term, but is always qualified by reference to the Imperial pound. The usual equivalent is either 38 lbs. or 36 lbs. and varies in different districts and with different commodities.

The paraffin or kerosene tin made to contain 4 and one-sixth gallons is in common use among the natives for transactions in grain, potatoes and coffee but endeavours are being made to introduce half bushel measures as a unit for transactions of this nature.

The use of Imperial or Metric weights and measures is enforced in the principal trading centres and a regular system of annual re-verification and inspection is carried out (this is held in abeyance pending the appointment of a new Deputy Inspector of Weights and Measures.)

SECTION 22 - PRODUCTION & NATURAL RESOURCES.(4) WATER POWER.

The demand for electricity in the township of Nairobi and surrounding districts is met by the hydro-electric station on the Maragua River at its confluence with the Tana. This scheme is supplemented by the hydro-electric station on the Thika River, and also a smaller hydro-electric station on the Maragua River, upstream of the main generating station. Future demands may be met from the Tana River in the stretch extending from just above the infall of the Maragua River to the falls at Seven Forks. There are a number of small schemes installed and operated by private landowners for working farm factories, principally on sisal and tea estates.

Demands for forest products to meet the requirements of the War effort increased during the year, and were reflected in the Forest Revenue for 1943, which amounted to £.140,492 as compared with £.119,025 in 1942.

Expenditure for 1943 was £.45,646 as compared with £.38,688 in 1942.

(a) Messrs: British Overseas Airways Corporation provide (i) a twice weekly service to South Africa (ii) a twice weekly service to Egypt and India with weekly connections from the Sudan to West Africa and from West Africa to North and South America and the West Indies, (iii) a twice weekly service to the United Kingdom for Airgraph letters and (iv) a service to Australia and New Zealand for Airgraph letters.
