

I have the honor to report that I have this day examined Mr J.C.Bradenell Bruce and he was rejected for the army as he is flat footed and though not a cripple his feet become painful after a ten mile walk. The degree of flat foot is not great and should cause no inconvenience for short distances. He is myopic but vision is good with glasses. There is no sign of organic disease. In my opinion if the inability to walk say 8 miles does not exclude he is fit for service as an Assistant District Commissioner in East Africa.
