Sir,

I am commanded by the Army Council to acknowledge receipt of Colonial Office letter No. 52193/1914 dated 2nd. January 1915 and enclosures.

The Council desire me to say that a Memorandum on the Military position in the East Africa Protectorate is being prepared at the suggestion of the Foreign Office for communication to the Belgian Government, which the Foreign Office will be requested to pass - before communication to that Government - to the Colonial Office; and it is hoped that the views therein expressed will be found to meet the wishes of Mr. Secretary Harcourt in the latter part of paragraph 3 of the letter under reply.

In conclusion the Council trust that informal statements, which may happen to be made by subordinate military officers to members of the Chartered Company, may not be regarded as in any way indicative of the policy likely to be adopted by the War Office.
