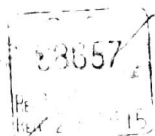

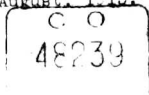

Dear Mr. Lambert,

We shall be very much obliged if you can tell us whether the Colonial Office have any information regarding the Moravian Brethren who appear to have mission stations all over the British Empire. We have had a report that these stations may possibly be used as a means of communication with the enemy, the Society having its headquarters in Germany and having come originally from Saxony. We have made enquiries with regard to their London office and find that the President of the Mission in England and also the Secretary have distinctly German names. The Society, which originally started purely as a Low Church Missionary Organisation, has since in its colonial branches become more or less a trading

Society, ostensibly with the object of providing the wherewithal to carry on their work.

I enclose for your information a copy of the Moravian Almanack, giving the list of their stations. In pages 10 to 113 you will note the list of the stations in the C. Indies, and you will note the large number of German names amongst the officers.

Our reports are particularly to their activities in South and West Africa, and if you have any reports from that part of the world we shall be very glad to see them.

Please return the Almanack.
