

SIR,

With reference to paragraph 6 of your letter 45635 of 8th July last, relative to military expenditure in East Africa, I am commanded by the Army Council to send you the enclosed copy of a letter dated 25th September in which the Treasury refer to charges for interest being included in the sum of charges account under certain conditions

As regards paragraph 8 of your letter of 8th July, dealing with pensions and other non-effective charges, I am to state that separate communication will be addressed to you in due course

With reference to your letter 45071 of 2nd October, relative to the method of accounting for expenditure, I am to state that the Council will accept the Audit certificate as proof of payments made by the Protectorate Government from War Office advances, and they concur in the instructions which Mr. Bonar Law proposes to send to the Governor.

Sir,

With reference to Mr. Cubitt's letter of the 11th ultime (15/I.O./3582. P.1.), I am directed by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury to transmit herewith to be laid before the Army Council A copy of a letter dated the 14th instant, which They have received from the Colonial Office, with its enclosure, relative to the amount of the advances made by the Protectorate Treasury to meet charges common to the several forces operating in the East Africa Protectorate.

My Lords would be glad if the Army Council would now cause the sum of £1,010,400 to be paid, as suggested by the Colonial Office, to the Crown Agents, the ultimate incidence of the expenditure to be settled hereafter as indicated in the previous correspondence.

My Lords agree that the interest on the overdrafts by which the Protectorate financed the common expenditure, from the dates on which they were obtained (provided that the particular overdrafts can be earmarked, until they are replaced by War Office advances should be added to the amount of the common charges for allocation finally in the proportion in which the whole account is divided, and that interest should similarly accrue on the War Office advances from the dates on which they are made until the Protectorate repays its share of the common war charges. They think that the interest in both cases may properly be calculated at 5% per annum.
