Sir,

With reference to the accompanying letter of our date transmitting to you our inability to continue to maintain our East African Service in accordance with the terms of the Agreement of 18th August 1910, we now beg to state that, while the necessity of taking this step has been imposed upon us by circumstances beyond our control, we should nevertheless have much pleasure in consulting with the Colonial Office or the Green Agents the steps on which an Agreement could be arrived at, if possible, on the one hand, under the existing stage of the war, and, on the other hand, providing for a reasonably regular service to and from East Africa whenever such normal conditions of trade are restored.

Meanwhile, with reference to your letter of the 2nd ultimo, we are unable to forward the sufficient East African Posts of Call for any time ahead, as these are momently covered with no sufficient information relating to cover the very heavy expense of the present situation under the circumstances of martial law.
