We have been consulted by Mr L.W.Ritch in reference to the circumstances under which he was deported from British East Africa in Movember of last year.

Mr Ritch has handed us the correspondence which he has had with your Department and also with the war Office and we gather that after a good many months discussion between the two Departments the matter has now been definitely relegated to your Office.

Mr Ritch has shown us the whole of the correspondence which started in January last and it seems clear to us that prima facis his cause of complaint is a very serious one.

Neither Mr Ritch nor surselves have any anxiety to trouble you with a personal matter in times like these, but we cannot help thinking that this a case which ought to be dealt with seriously and immediately.

Although the correspondence has now lasted for some six months, no explanation whatever has been offered to Mr Ritch of the reasons for the treatment which he received.

We assume that by now you have received full reports from the

officials on the spot and we venture to suggest that an interview should be given to our fir william Bull at which he should be furnished with a full explanation as to the grounds for the action taken by the local officials.

gir William Bull is anxious for obvious reasons that this matter should be dealt with immediately and without the necessity for any public action being taken and we shall be grateful if you will give him an interview at the earliest possible date.
