Sir,

I am directed by the Secretary of State to inform you that, subject to your being passed as physically fit for service, he proposes to select you for appointment as a Postal Clerk and Telegraphist in East Africa with salary at the rate of £110 per annum rising by annual increments of 2s to £150 per annum.

2. Furnished quarters will be provided by the Government free of cost, but not of rates or other similar outgoings. Free second class passages will be provided to and from East Africa, and a free pass over the Uganda Railway between Mombasa and the place at which you are stationed.

3. A memorandum showing the general conditions attached to appointments in East Africa and a copy of the leave and pension regulations are enclosed herewith. It is for you to understand that you will be subject to any regulations which may be introduced hereafter by or with the sanction of the Secretary of State. Copies of the regulations as to pensions and of the Colonial Regulations are also enclosed.

You will be seconded in the first instance in the Home Service for a tour of thirty months in East Africa, and the leave incidental thereto, and at the end of that period you may either be confirmed in your appointment on the permanent establishment in East Africa, if your services have been satisfactory and are still required by the Government, or you may report to the Home Service.

You must understand that you are liable to serve either in the East Africa Protectorate or Uganda, and that you may be transferred from either of these Protectorates to the other, according to the requirements of the Government.

You will be paid half salary as from the date of despatch for East Africa and full salary as from the date of arrival at Kampala.

You will be provided with free medical attendance in East Africa whilst in the service of the Government.

In the event of your being married during the term of your service in East Africa, you will be required to resign your office, and to refund to the Government the cost of your maintenance last year. Nevertheless, you give six months' notice to the Government of your intention to marry, the Secretary of State may, on the recommendation of the Governor, abate a proportionate amount of the marriage money according to the period served. In the event of your being married, you will be granted a gratuity

(not exceeding twelve months' pay in the aggregate of one month's pay for each year's service, provided that you have completed two years' service in East Africa, and an aggregate of six years' service in the Home and East African Postal Services.

9. In the event of your returning to the Home Service at the end of the period for which you are seconded, pension or gratuity will be granted to you from East African funds in respect of that period or final retirement from the Home Service, provided that you are entitled to pension or gratuity in accordance with the principles of the Superannuation Act of 1931. The amount of the pension or gratuity from Protectorate funds will be reckoned on the salary drawn at the date of leaving the East African service in accordance with the regulations as to pensions and gratuities applicable to East Africa.

10. If you are prepared to accept this offer of appointment, you should present yourself at once to one of the Medical Advisers to this Department whose names are given on the enclosed letter, for the purpose of being medically examined. The letter is to be left with him, and he will send his report direct to this Department. The fee of one guinea for the examination will be paid by the Government, and if it is necessary for you to make a journey by railway to visit the Medical Adviser you may put a claim for the refund of the return railway fare (third class).

11. I am to request that you will inform me without delay whether you wish to accept the offer of this appointment. You should also inform me what is the earliest date on which you will be able to leave for East Africa where your services are urgently required.

12. In replying to this letter, if you accept the offer of appointment, you should give the name and address of a relative in this country to whom communications can be sent, if necessary, in your absence.
