21 non-commissioned officers (superior.grade) for the officering of their new native troops on the German E.A. (ugands) frontier. There is no Union Castle or British India life steamer until the 1st week in June ex London, arriving at Mombasa about mia July.

I am directed by Mr. Secretary Harcourt to enclose, for the consideration of the Army Council, a copy of a letter received from Major E.H.W.Leggett, D.S.O. of the British Bast Africa Corporation, with regard to an enquiry from the Belgian Colonial Office as to the best means of sending out three officers and twenty-one non-commissioned officers to the Selgian Counce.

2. The Holgian Colonial Office ask whether, if these officers and non-commissioned officers were sent to Ades by the Peninsular and Oriental boat leaving Lenden on May let, the rest of the journey to Hombana could be made in a Government transport.
