Dear Read,

The Belgian Colonial Office has instructed us that
 concerning with the shipment of £62,500 value parcel of their
 Congo gold, now ready at Mombasa to be shipped in s.s. "CLUNY
 CASTLE", the gold is no longer to be consigned to Standard Bank
 of South Africa, Capetown, for account bank of England, as heretofore,
 but is to be landed at Durban, and to be forwarded thence,
 under arrangements to be made by B.E.A. Corp. Ltd., consigned
 to Standard Bank of South Africa, Johannesburg, for account
 Messrs. Lazard Brothers.

We have arranged this matter with the Union Castle Line,
 by whose steamers the consignments are shipped from Mombasa, and
 their Durban office is being instructed by them, by confidential
 letter this mail (which will arrive before the ship), to land and
 to forward the gold accordingly.

Perhaps you would very kindly cause cable to be sent
 in your cipher to "Cox Corporation Mombasa" to effect that, -

"Belgian Government instructs that Congo gold Cluny Castle
 and all following shipments to be consigned to Union Castle
 Manager Durban letter has been instructed regarding further
 disposal - stop strong rooms have been obstructed Cluny
 Comrie Berwick Castle arrange with Monsieur Braive ship-
 ment by each of these - stop twentyfour Egyptian sailors
 sailed Cluny Castle for Mombasa Corporation to forward
 utmost urgency Moulaert at Rutshuru battery immobilised
 until their arrival".

Dear Leggett,

Before the receipt of your letter of July 14th on the subject of shipments of gold from the Belgian Congo to South Africa, the following message from Mr Cox "through the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate was received here:-

"Third consignment of gold from Kilo consisting of sixteen boxes valuing approximately sixty-six thousand pounds deposited to-day (July 14th) Standard Bank of South Africa Limited, Mombasa, awaiting arrival of 'Gumny Castle'"

2. On receipt of your letter referred to a telegram in the terms suggested by you was sent to the Governor for transmission to Mr Cox.
