First Paragraph.

The draughtsman appears to have omitted the words which expression shall include where the context so samite their successors of permitted assigns after the word "hereinafter referred to as the lessees" in line 5. The result of this appears to be that the covenants of the lessees do not extend to their successors and assigns. I should prepose to aid the words acove mentioned as a covenant of the lessees do not extend to their successors and as-

First Schedule, First Part , Last paragraph.

The winds and at any time may be required in lines and 6 seem to be unnecessary and ambiguous since it will be impossible to rule out of the Concession at the date of the lease lands which may subsequently be required for the purposes mentioned. It should further be observed that the draft contains in clause 7 the covenant by the lessees to surrender any lands which may be required for this purpose at any time on receipt of notice.

With regard to the lands subject to the Diespecker and Macallister concessions these have already been dealt with in the Colonial Office despatch of the It was pointed out in that despetch that the effect of this paragraph of the draft would be to exclude permanently from the East African Estates Concession all lands within

the boundaries of the Diespecker and Macallister leases even though the leases with regard to these landsor any part of them may never become effective.

It is understood from Colonel Owen Thomas that he regards this as being the proper interpretation of this paragraph. He says however that it was originally the intention of the government and himself that this land should be thrown into the East African Estates Concess: if the negotiations with regard to the Piespecker and macallister concessions fell through. In connection with this point it may be further mentioned that the definition of Mestern boundary in this pare of the schedule will require alteration, since there is nothing in the draft, as now drawn, to show what the direction of the line mentioned in the first line of the lest paragraph should be and whether it should be straight or not. It would seem prima facie to te desirable that the line should be as far as possible parallel to the const line, and this view is shared by Colonel Owen Thomas. One possible definition would be to make the line run straight 21° east of --- true north, or paralled to a line connecting Chimomi and Mombasa. It does not appear that it will be possible to have a straight line unless some of the Diespecker and Macallister lands are to be included.

There appears to be some confusion between this paragraph of the Senedule and clauses 11 and 21 of the wraft lease. The sc edule excludes from the area granted, mango forests, land required for government and Admiralty purposes, lands already leased or granted, lands subject to the Diespecker and Macallister Concessions and all lands privately owned, and directs that these lands are to be particularly

particularly delimited on the unnexed n.an. Clause II of the draft directs that all privately owned land end land in which natives have rights and all true forest areas exceeding one square mile are to be demarcated and not included in the survey plans. It would appear to be the intention of clause il that not only privately owned land, which is specifically excluded by the lest paragr ph of the fi at schedule, but also hands on which natives have rights and forest areas exceeding one square mile should be excluded from the lease; but if this is, the intention the native lands and forest areas should be included in the exception contained in the last paragraph of the first schemie and that p regraph and the second paragraph of clouse Il should be prought 1.t. agree e. . The arrange Colonel Thomas' view this made the question of an external water supply additionally important. In any event, the words mentioned require more precise definition if they are intended to have the effect above referred to.

It would seem to be prefemble that the rate of mould rive gradually to £1500 in proportion with the advance of the survey and eloude nut jump suddenly

as is at present provided in this clause. It was suggested to Colonel Owen Thomas that the rate might rise from £50 to 270 when one quarter of the 2,500 acres was surveyed and so on, with possibly a previse that the whele survey should be completed within show specified time. Colemel Thomas suggested 16 years as a reasonable time. He stated however that he atvached very great impertance to the retention of the clause as difficulting this respect, in so as it constituted a strong inducement to the government to complete the survey at once. There sere also certain respects in which partial survey, although would as we lutended, be quite sufficient to enable the Company to keep pace with the demands of cultivation and supletting might not be sufficient to anable the Company to carry out the necessary operations in the way of reed and railes making (for example) to ensure the general development of their concession. He said, however, that he was quite ready to accept any modification which sould make it plain that the increased cent the not be with-held merely on the ground of some technical failure of the government to complete the survey, as, far instance, the insbility to advance the Western boundary.

It is further observed that the drafting of this clause is not satisfactory. In the rents are to be paid in advance it will not be possible for all payments to be made on the lat of January. For instance, the first payment must take place on the execution of the lease and the first payments in respect of the £1500 and £2000 rents will also be payable on some day other than the lat of January unless the plan referred to in this clause is approved on the lat January. The clause should be re-drawn to meet these points.

The wording of this clause is very unsatisfactory.

As it stands it is obviously impossible for the government to accept since the lessees would be able to defeat

On the other hand the wording of clause 28 of the original large obviously went too far in the other direction since it was impossible to expect the lessees to cantinue to use and occupy the wildless of the demised premises. It would appear to be sufficient if the lessees were compelled to maintain the standard of development which is imposed on them by clause 4 of the draft, but if a provision is to be drafted on these lines a proviso will have to be inserted in enter to enable them to let land go out of cultivation in the ordinary course of agriculture, or in order to bring other land into cultivation of a different nature where they desire to do so.
