Declaration to be made by the Widow of a Member of the Volunteer Force in support of her claim to Pension for herself, and Compassionate Allowance for her children.

do solemnly and sincerely declare, that I was lawfully married at Hawaii
on the 5th April day of 1914
to Anné Frank Arnold
who died at Manila
on the 15th day of Dec 1915
aged fifty one years
that since his decease I have continued a widow, and am so at this present time; and that the following are true particulars of the late A. F. Arnold's legitimate children now living

(Boys under 18, and girls under 21 years of age only.)

£300 for Mrs. Arnoldi and £100 for each of the two children, and I should be glad if the payment of these amounts could be authorized at an early date.

4. The necessary certificates in respect of Mrs. Arnoldi's marriage and of the birth of her two children are being obtained from South Africa, but in the meantime, owing to her immediate necessities, I have approved the grant to her of £100 from the sums referred to in paragraphs 2 and 3 above in accordance with the ruling given in paragraph 5 of Mr. Harcourt's despatch No. 228 of the 7th of April 1915, and I trust that my action may be approved.
