I am re. to transmit to you to be laid before the B. & T. the acc. copy of a despatch from the Gov. of the Ind. asking whether the ports of that and other British Protectorates are to be regarded as "foreign ports" within the meaning of the Order in Council of the 10th of Nov. 1914.

Mr. Bonar Law presumes that it is not the intention
