No objection to making papers referred to confidential. Decision has since been taken to assimilate pay and allowances of Rhodesian Regiment as far as possible

to those of Union troops with effect from arrival of South African brigade in East Africa, Imperial rates being borne by Army funds and excess by special grants

and vote of credit as in my despatch of 18th November. Following is detailed statement as to rates and incidence of cost in each case.
