the Troops Jubaland ^{troops} Kisimayu urgently required (Ends.)
General Officer Commanding has arranged to send
Arab rifles consisting of five British Officers
one Native Officer and 202 rank and file under the
command of Mure Assistant District Commissioner to
Kisimayu.


