GOVERNMENT OF PUNJAB

March 20, 1916.

Sir,

I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt
of your despatch No. 516 of the 20th of December
b6 818 1915 enclosing copies of further correspondence
with Captain H. R. H. Ireland on the subject of
his farm in the Mandi district.

2. I observe that Captain Ireland states that
he is the actual owner or lessee of the land from
the Government, and on that statement I stand
convicted of an illegal transaction. The farm
still stands in the name of Mr. Fairbairn, on whose
behalf the rent is paid by a local firm of
solicitors, and until he obtains his lease,
which has not yet been issued, he is unable to transfer
the land to Captain Ireland.

3. I am well aware that these illegal
transactions are common practice, but the persons
concerned presumably take into account the difficulties
