Coast Detachment reports enemy patrol at Mshiwu.

Intelligence Department report: - That enemy's woncentration appears to be en the Lumi River, South of Tavara, with 1,600 rifles at Salaita, the latter being supported by an entrenched camp four miles nearer Taveta. 
