with the Secy. of the Interior,

basis; but this proposal  
assumes that a hard  
and fast allocation,  
principally on a recurring  
basis, will be possible  
for any part of the  
concern charges, and it  
~~is~~ seems doubtful  
whether such an arrangement  
will be practicable. I am  
to mention that the  
Governor's views on the  
final allocation have  
not yet been received.  
I am to add that  
the other conditions in  
the Governor's letter will

require individual  
examination, and  
in some cases explanation,  
but this can be deferred  
until L.C. have given  
their decision on the  
general point whether  
the cost of auxiliary  
units, locally raised  
and serving important  
units generally, is to  
be borne on the Common  
Charge Account or  
by the Private Post  
alone.
