THE DETAILS.

- 13 Mr. Llewellin in a letter dated wajneir August 15th reports that as for as he can acceptain the her Afgab Section of the Aulikan are still on the Bide Gutchi vide Free!s August 5th I.(iii). He thinks that the Aulihan are now watering at Bil Nok and Abdurrancon Mursual is still at Faf Hadun.
- (ii) In a second latter dated August 24th Mr.

 Liemilin reports that the Mohamed Ambeir have now demonstrated their leyalty is the Government. They have supplied all his wants in camels.
- Lurks Jabba, some 40 miles from the Juba River, stated to him that as far as that there are no Aulihan. They have apparently moved East and morth-East, being measest to Hil Bak Just noof Kul Kulshiwai (marabit Map XII D) and extending morth as far as some is miles due wear of bonli (Map XIII 0) where they are close to the merchan, nor tulhal are blowdin has heard that they intend to push up between the Marchan, her Farsh Ugas, and the river and would then cross into Abyceimian territory near Dolo to the Aulihan under Fitaurari Augusi Bela.
- (iv) The Governor of Italian Semaliland, after consulting the Authorities at Rome, has replied to our telegram (vide Fredis, September 2nd, IV) that passage through Italian erritory will be granted to our treops, but that it is hoped that the move can be deferred for the present and that a larger force will be sent. The matter is under consideration. The Italian authorities appear to think that immediate action against the rebels is contemplated whereas all that is desired for the present is the re-occupation of Serenti.
