 Precis for week anding Saturday October 21st.1916.

- In a letter dated Moyale September 22nd. Mr. Butler writes that he has received a letter dated September 3rd from Aden Shaba, a Carren headman, which after pretestations of leyelty and a request for rifles states that Abdurrahman Marsaul has asked the Carren to sell him rifles and ammunition or, failing that, to great him a passage through their country to Abyssinis in order that he might purchase them. The Carren refused.
- (11) Aden Shaba further states that the Dagodia and the Marchan have come to an agreement at Malka Re (Map XII-a), Handedu, and Jirimi (not shown, but west of Malka Ré), that the Dagodia from the Abyssinian districts of Odo and Bei are collecting on the Daua River and an attack on the Garreh is feared.
- (iii) Two Garreh have been killed by Dagodia from Wajheir. The tribe is grazing on the Daua river during the dry season (iv) Many Tigre are resorted at enkali (IX-a).
- (v. Mr. Menday in a letter from Burna (VIII-c) dated September 5th reports that the Darrawa, cousins of the Carren chiefly resident in Italian territory, state that mother Aulthan caravan of it camels has wraited Mehamed adou, Carren, at Korkaiys (Kokaiya, I-b). The saravan was well equipped with aleth and was trying to buy cartridges. This caravan is supposed to have brought now that he Aulthan cattle and sheep have been sent to water at Salagli (XIII-e) while the camels are moving north and will remain in the vicinity of Samensedera and Bambu, & hours South of Yabitahu (II-a). At the break of the rains the cattle and sheep will move north via Wanti, (east of Eil Wak) and will remain south of the Daua river until it becomes formable, when they will cross into Abyseinia. The Garrah are stated to be in agreement with these plans.
