- 2. As Wre Schuimyn has four children and is under 35 years of age, she would appear to be entitled to a pension of 228/6d per week. Consequently I have approved the grant of a provisional pension of 208/- per week pending receipt of your instructions in the matter.
- 3. I enclose herewith the widow's declaration in support of her claim, together with certified copies of her marriage certificate, and the birth certificates of her four children.
