Foreign Office, April 15th, 1916. 5.30 p.m.

As result of Portuguese and Belgian co-operation in East Africa parts of German territory will fall into hands of Portuguese and Belgian troops. Their advance will be directly due to our assistance and to withdrawal of enemy from these areas owing to our military pressure.

You should inform Government to which you are accredited that all British and other occupation of German East Africa should be regarded as temporary and provisional pending final settlement at the end of the war; but that to avoid confusion and for purpose of uniformity and convenience we think whole administrative control should be in British hands till the end of the war.

You should express the hope that Government to which you are accredited will agree and inform you as soon as possible in order that instructions may be sent to General Smuts.
