With reference to your letter 41890/1916 of the 5th September, I am directed by the Board of Trade to suggest, for Mr. Bonar Law's consideration, that the most appropriate method of announcing to interested persons in this country that certain firms in British East Africa are in process of liquidation would be to insert a notice in the "Board of Trade Journal" and to send advance proofs thereof to the press.

If Mr. Bonar Law approves of this course and will forward to this Department the notice in the form in which he desires it to appear, the Board will cause action to be taken on the lines suggested.
