 a soldier in the British Army, they  
 would have awarded him a pension  
 of 27/- a week. It appears, however,  
 that they were, in fact, proceeding  
 on the assumption that his disability  
 was wholly due to active service which  
 is not the case. I don't think any  
 good would be done by contesting the  
 point, and we had better accept  
 the W.O. decision. The case will stand

I am commanded by the Army Council to refer to your letter of the 26th March last, No. 13957, and to enclose, <sup>NO</sup> for the information of Mr Edgar Law, a copy of correspondence which has passed between this Department and the Commissioners of Chelsea Hospital regarding the award of a pension to

T.S. Kiely, late of the East Africa Transport Corps.

It will be seen that, on the information furnished by the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate in his despatch of the 24th December, the Commissioners of Chelsea Hospital would have awarded to Kiely, if he had been a soldier of the Regular forces, a pension at the rate of 4s. 8d. a week from the 18th September 1915 to the 29th February 1916 and then at the rate of 22s. a week to the 17th March (to complete six months), from which date, as they have since reported, it would have been renewed at the 22s. rate for a further period of six months.

The Council agree that pension for this man, at the foregoing rates for the periods stated, may be charged to the Common Charges Account.

The Council are aware from your letters of the 2nd March and 6th June 1916, Nos. 7669 and 25823, that Kiely has received from the Crown Agents a pension of 27s. a week from

from the 16th September 1915 to the 18th May 1916, under the authority of your Department. This award was made on an assumption regarding the cause of his disability for which the Council accept no responsibility, and they regret that they cannot consent to Army funds being charged (through the Common Charges Account or otherwise) with any share of the payments in excess of those sanctioned by Army regulations as stated in the preceding paragraph.

Sir,

With reference to your letter of the 6th instant, Ref 0165/7145 (P.3) regarding Mr. T.V. Kiely, formerly Corporal in the East Africa Transport Corps, I am directed to inform you that the previous recommendation of the Commissioners of the Royal Hospital that he should be granted a pension of 27s. a week for six months conditional in the first instance was made on the assumption that his disability was due to service in the present war, as suggested in your letter of the 1st January 1916.

The further papers forwarded with your letter of the 6th instant, have been submitted to the Director General of Army Medical Service who has recorded his opinion that Corporal Kiely should be given the benefit of any doubt and his disability regarded as "aggravated" by his active service in East Africa.

In view of this opinion, the award which would have been made by the Commissioners if Mr. Kiely had been a soldier of the British Army would have been 4s. 8d. a week from date of discharge to the 29th February 1916, followed by 22s. a week from the 1st March 1916 for the remainder of a period of six months conditional, instead of 27s. a week for the whole period, as originally recommended.

The Commissioners received notification in February last that the Secretary of State for the Colonies has approved of Mr. Kiely being granted a pension of 27s. a

week as from the 18th September 1915, and that the issue of the pension would be continued until the end of the current month. They have now been requested by the Colonial Office to arrange that a further Medical Board may be held with a view to a decision as to the continuance of the pension, and they will therefore be glad to receive a copy of the reply which is sent by your Department to the Colonial Office on the subject of the pension already issued to Mr. Kiely.
