
I have the honour to refer to paragraph 5 (b) of "The Medical Practitioners and Dentists Ordinance 1910" in which it is stated that the holder of a degree or licence in medicine and surgery of any medical school in the United States of America, the degrees, diplomas and licences of which are recognized as entitling to registration by the General Council of Medical Education and Registration in the United Kingdom, shall be entitled to registration under the Ordinance.

2. It does not appear that this power has been acted upon in this Protectorate and I have the honour to enquire if the General Medical Council has recognized the qualifications of any of the Schools of the United States of America, and, if so, to ask that I may be furnished with a list thereof.
