With reference to your predecessor's despatch No. 555 dated the 11th of August 1916, on the subject of the allowance which is made to married officers in respect of the cost of their wives' passages, I have the honour to enquire if the ruling therein contained is to be considered applicable to the wives of officers of the King's African Rifles.

2. Although the King's African Rifles are not now in the service of the East Africa Protectorate I should have no objection to offer should you be prepared to allow the privilege to extend to the wives of King's African Rifles officers.
