Sir,

With reference to Mr. Harcourt's despatch No. 670 of the 19th of August 1913, I have the honour to inform you that 50 cases of enteric fever were reported as having occurred among the European residents in this Protectorate during the year 1916. Three of the cases proved fatal.

- 2. None of the three fatal cases had been previously inoculated.
- 3. The total number of Europeans, other than military, in the Protectorate in 1916, was approximately 5,700.
- 4. The above returns do not include cases which have occurred amongst the Military.
