Mr. Butler,

All the information which I have previously received regarding these accounts is contained in paragraphs 128/125 of the Auditor's Report on the account of war expenditure for 1915-16 (E.A.P./20226/17).

Mr. Barnes evidently maintains the view, therein expressed, that the detailed examination of these accounts can only be conducted satisfactorily by officials, like the accounting staff specially sent from India, who possess a full knowledge of the Indian regulations which govern them. On the information before me and having regard to the responsibilities which already devolve upon this Department, in connection with the military accounts in East Africa, I am inclined to concur in Mr. Barnes's view, the adoption of which would have the effect of limiting his responsibility, so far as the military railway accounts are concerned, to seeing that the figures which have been accepted by the Chief Paymaster, East African Pay Corps, are certified by the appointed Examiner as being correct, and that they are accurately embodied in the Chief Paymaster's accounts.
