

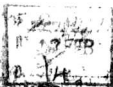
This N.C.O. was admitted to hospital on 20-10-17 suffering from Malaria and Dysentery. Every thing possible was done, but unfortunately in spite of most careful treatment, he died on 28th October 1917.

He was attended by a Church of England Chaplain and buried with Military Honours in the Military Cemetery, Dar-es-Salaam. His grave is marked with a Cross, duly inscribed.
