

Sir,

My Paris Correspondent, Mr. G. Guigniony,
65, Boulevard des Batignolles, Paris, writes me as follows:

I got recently a telegram from my Agent at Mombassa
saying that according to the ordinance N° 12, the sale
and lease of grounds and buildings to foreign subjects is
prohibited during the war.

Considering that I have very often large stocks of
goods lying at Mombassa, owing to the scarcity of freight
and further that I am establishing at Mombassa a soap fac-
tory, which requires much material, I am obliged to buy or
let a ground or building at Mombassa or in the vicinity.

In consequence of the prohibition referred to in the
telegram of my Agent, all my business would be stopped, if
the Colonial Office could not grant me the authorization
asked for by my Agent at Mombassa.

Mr. Guigniony points out the building up of his soap
factory will contribute to the development of the trade in
Mombassa and help the local population, as soap is very
scarce over there.

As references, I may add that Mr. Guigniony was former-
ly vice Consul of France in Abyssinia, he is established
since many years at Djibouti, Addis-Abeba, Due Dawa, etc.,
and his firm is a highly respectable one.
