1031 27th August Your telegram 12th July I have been requested to transmit following petition from Indian residents in Mombasa for submission to His Majesty the King begins Mombasa Indian residents petition in respect of five Bhadala prisoners convicted in criminal case No. 68 of 1917 of His Majesty's High Court for East Africa to whom leave to appeal was refused on technical grounds praying for their reprieve or commutation by His Majesty of sentences of death ends. On receipt of your telegram of ^{July} June 12th I considered case with Executive Council and I confirmed sentences of death. Subsequently to August 23rd I considered similar petition from Indian residents with Executive Council and found no reason for [?] vary original decision. Petition transmitted herewith is result. There is in my opinion no reason why the ordinary course of (?) justice should be departed from.
