With regard to placing orders in Canada there is no special procedure given placing the order. But the question has arisen of what is the position with regard to orders placed with Canadian houses that are merely acting as entrepreneurs for goods manufactured in the U.S. The essence of the problem is, of course, finance: & we are putting it to the American Bd. on other papers. I do not know that we can say anything more on this till we have their orders. This order for Ford cars would doubtless be a case in point.

The Priority (List at the imports end) would be nearly a local arrangement. We should doubtless ask the C'dian govt. to give facilities in cases of specific orders properly backed. But in this instance the real question is that of shipping which is in the province of H.M.G. It is not clear whether the orders referred to have been placed.

 Bd. must wait for developments in the case put to the
 American Board: but in the meantime (subject to concurrence
 of Dominion Dept) we might offer to ask the Canadian Govt.
 to grant such facilities as may be possible in the case of
 any specific orders placed in Canada if EOP will give
 particulars of specific cases, but that shipping may
