2. A further telegram has now been
 received from Mr. Bowring stating that, owing
 to the impossibility of importing specie, it
 is becoming necessary to use rupee notes for
 general currency purposes. ~~The local~~
~~currency position has been somewhat improved~~
~~owing to the fact that hoarded rupees have~~
~~come into circulation for the purchase of~~
~~imported food by natives.~~ In these circum-
 stances Mr. Long considers that it is necessary
 to modify the arrangements previously in force
 in the sense desired by the O.A.G., and he
 will be glad to learn at an early date that

the Banks agree.
