30/10/18/59 With reference to your despatch No. 273 of the 24th April last, enclosing correspondence regarding a complaint made by Monsieur Emile Jardin as to the raising of the rent of his shop premises in Nairobi, I have the honour to observe that these premises do not come within the scope of the Rents Restriction Ordinance 1918, recently passed in this Protectorate.

Govt. 2281D 2. As explained in the statement of objects and reasons for the Ordinance, which was forwarded to you in my despatch No. 174 of the 14th of March 1918, the measure was framed to include in its operation dwelling houses of a rental not exceeding £80 per annum, a rate which in this Protectorate is comparable to the rents to which similar legislation applies in the United Kingdom.

3. I have discussed the matter with the Executive Council, and am of opinion that it is not at present desirable to extend the principle of restriction of rents to the larger and more expensive premises.
