ment of the East Africa Protectorate to the Secy of State for the Colonies.

REC'D 9 SEP

Dated 7th September.

(Received Colonial Office 9.55 p.m.)

1101 7th September. Representations have been made to me of great difficulty experienced by Civil officers who have been given leave to England obtaining boat accommodation as no officer is allowed to proceed for special reasons would be grateful if arrangements could be made with Admiralty for every facility as far as possible. Names and probable date of arrival at South Africa could be telegraphed by me to Naval transport Officer, Cape Town as soon as known in order to give time for making arrangements. Understand that arrangements on these lines already exist in case of officials of Government of India proceeding homewards via Cape. Briscoe? Assistant District Commissioner? My despatch 13th April 501 wife and child waiting at Cape Town for 7 weeks up to 19th July with no prospect of getting away. Not known whether he sailed subsequently

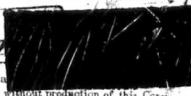
