Sir,

With reference to Sir H. C. Belfield's confidential despatch No. 145 of 2nd November 1916, I have the honour to report that Trooper G. C. Tross Devey, late East Africa Mounted Rifles and East African Scouts was discharged in South Africa medically unfit on the 3rd July 1918.

The Imperial Pensions Board in South Africa, taking into consideration that Mr. Tross Devey's pre war earnings were at the rate of £250 a year, have awarded him an alternative pension of £2. 13. 12 weekly with effect from the 4th July 1918 up to the 31st May 1919, subject to medical re-examination prior to the latter date. I have confirmed this award.
