

Dear Sir,

Referring to the interview that Mr. Sjogren and I on behalf of Lord Waleran, had with you last week, it would be a great convenience to us and might advance matters if before Mr. Sjogren returns to East Africa in September it were possible for us to have certain information placed at our disposal here.

1. The original preliminary survey map shows two areas, the Macalister and the Diespecker Concessions, totalling together 128,000 acres. Lord Waleran is under the impression that part of this area has now been reserved for the Government, including part of the Shimba Hills and the southern portion has also been lopped off. It is important, I think, to ascertain whether his impression as to this is correct.

2. As we have no data here to go upon it would be helpful if a plan were available showing approximately the areas that are defined and proved as belonging to Natives and what areas forming part of the original Concession are in fact still available.

3. To ascertain if possible the total area that is available within the Concession and their approximate situation. Also if possible the estimated area of each compact block that would lend itself for development.

I think with this information before us it would enable us to convey our views fully to Mr. Sjogren before he returns to the Protectorate in September next. We should be extremely obliged to you if you could obtain this information for us.


