With reference to Sir Charles Bowring's despatch No. 42 of 11th January last, I have the honour to transmit herewith a petition addressed to Your Lordship by Mr. O. G. G. Kraft, late of the East Africa Pioneers, praying for an increase in the rate of military pension granted to him.

2. I also enclose a letter received from Mr. Kraft in reply to an enquiry as to his pre war earnings. This has been referred to the Governor of Seychelles for verification of the statements therein contained.

3. Enquiries have been made as to Mr. Kraft's present occupation, and it has been ascertained that his efforts to obtain employment have hitherto been unsuccessful.

4. It would appear that Mr. Kraft is entitled to claim an alternative pension the rate of which will depend on confirmation by the Governor of Seychelles of Mr. Kraft's statements as to his pre war earnings.

Indulgence and Commiseration
I beg to move

His Lordship The Right Honourable
The Secretary of State for the Colonies
to condescend giving to this humble petition
of mine an attentive perusal and an early consideration.
In duty bound petitioner will ever pray.

My Lord,

Your humble petitioner, Olav Gotfred Gunnarsson Kraft
most respectfully begs to be permitted to approach Your Lordship
with the sanguine hope of deriving the benefit of a favourable
reconsideration of his case.

Your petitioner, after serving as a first class
Pioneer in the East Africa Pioneer Corps for a period extending
to over three years, during which it was his sad fate to contract
such malignant fevers as Malaria and Enteric finally received his
discharge at the hands of the Staff Officer of the East African
Volunteers on the 7th December 1916, in consequence of his having
been found medically unfit for further service.

Your petitioner finding himself in a very sad plight
on his discharge through his being unable to secure a permanent
civil employment to the end of earning a livelihood respectfully
applied to the Local Authorities for a pension which was granted
to him on the line of £1-0-7½ per week, same to last for one
year in the first instance.

As a sequel, your petitioner who is still unemployed
in consequence of the various diseases under which he has been
labouring whilst on active service, has a wife to support.

Therefore your petitioner, in expressing his humblest
apology for having trespassed upon Your Lordship's valuable time,
humbly request that Your Lordship may be pleased to reconsider
the decision of the Local Authorities and to grant him a higher
and permanent pension so that the lot which has befallen on him
might be mitigated to a certain extent.

Your petitioner whilst expressing the weak expression
of the high sense of gratitude he shall ever retain, begs to
