With reference to your letter No. 6335/1919 of the 17th November in regard to the question of death duties on estates of French nationals in the coastal area of the East Africa Protectorate, I am directed by Earl Curzon of Kedleston to inform you that His Majesty's Government have already refused to allow the French to denounce the Anglo-French Agreement of 1901 unless they agree to the abrogation, in so far as Zanzibar is concerned, of the Muscat Treaty of 1844.

The French Government have refused to agree to such a procedure and Lord Curzon does not see therefore how he can at present suggest any solution for the difficulties to which you refer in your latter under reply.
