The operations of the Company are a means of bringing considerable revenue to the East Africa Protectorate. For every ton of Soda the Company produces from Lake Magadi and despatches to Kilindini at the coast for shipment it pays to the Uganda Railway a railway freight of 1d. per ton per mile, equivalent to about 1s/-. Again, for every ton of Soda the Company produces from Lake Magadi, it pays to the East Africa Protectorate a royalty of 2/-. Apart from these two important payments, the Company has imported and still imports large quantities of machinery and materials into the Colony, which also creates trade within the British Empire and are a source of revenue to the Protectorate, and the Company is also a large employer of native labour, again to the advantage of the Colony. The Company desires to emphasise the extreme importance of its operations in fostering a great enterprise in the East Africa Protectorate, one that is calculated to be of paramount interest for the welfare of that British Colony.

The Colonial Office in London has always extended sympathy towards this enterprise and on previous occasions has communicated with your Department expressing the view that it was in the public interest that the Company should be permitted to raise fresh capital.
