

I am commanded by the Army Council to acknowledge
the receipt of your letter No. 36801/1919, dated the 9th
July, 1919.

I am to inform you that the Council consider that
the application for trophies from the municipal Committee of
Nairobi should be met by you from the guns placed at your
disposal in War Office letter No. 57/20/1352 C.5.(T.) dated
23rd May, 1919.

In addition to the trophies mentioned in that
letter, I am to inform you that the Council have concurred
in the following allocations of captured war material by the
General Officer Commanding German East Africa:-

One ~~Wardenfeld~~ to the Nigerians.

One quick firer 1½ pounder and two muzzle loaders to
the King's African Rifles.

Machine Guns to the most deserving Units in the opinion
of the General Officer Commanding.

Rifles to all Units who have served with an
Expeditionary Force.
