As regards this letter we have  
no Regulations of 1914. They may  
be in a Gazette later than the last  
(March 25<sup>th</sup>) which we have received  
but the provision as to a maximum  
of 10% royalty on net profits  
attains priority in the 1905 Regulation

It is curious that his  
royalty does not refer to them or to  
the 1912 Ordinance itself, which presumably  
has been amended (except in the case  
of gold precious stones) - § 73 now.

He might not unreasonably claim that  
as the lease was not executed before  
the Ordinance & Regulations were brought  
into effect he has a right to their  
benefit. It may be that he would  
suffer in other respects, but I have not  
so far discovered where.

I sent off the royalty, also in  
a letter, but pending further orders  
I have not drafted to Gov. or to Myracland  
and his Office. I think the draft

Further to my letter of the 22nd April last, which  
 has not yet been acknowledged, may I point out that under the  
 existing regulations of 1914, page 14, para 26, the royalty for  
 minerals shall in no case be more than 10% of the nett profits.  
 I point out to shew how I have been handicapped in my  
 application that was made under the old conditions which were  
 presumed to be more lenient than the new ones. It also proved  
 that I am entitled in all fairness to a reduction in the royalty  
 at present asked for and would respectfully point out that I  
 should like a reply at as early a moment as possible as I am  
 in a hurry to return to Africa.
