CAPTAIN J. McCRAE

Medical certificate issued on 1st Jan 1919, stating that the illness necessitates disablement at 40 p.c. for a period of six months. If case had been for M/P he would have been awarded 270 p.c. from 1st Jan 1919 to 30th June 1919. Am informed that he might then apply for further medical examination. Returns orig. copies.

Mr. Robinson,

Capt. McCrae is on leave for M.P. on 1st Jan 1919. He retains his Commission in 1919 and he may wear uniform on his voyage, but he does not draw pay at the end of last year. On 31st Dec 1918 his Commission expires. It is requested whether the period during which he retains his rank on pay shall count towards gratuity on termination.

Whether retired pay should begin from the day following that on which he ceased to draw pay as an officer of the Royal Air Force, or from the date upon which he relinquishes his Commission.

As the special arrangement in this case is merely a matter of convenience for Capt. McCrae and he may be considered really to have been discharged on Jan. 1st, I think we should find that the period between January 1st and relinquishment should not count towards gratuity, and that retired pay should begin from the 1st of January. I do not think we can ask the S.A. or P. for

In reply to your letter No. 58489/1918 of the 17th ultimo, relative to the case of Captain D. McCrae, of the East African Military Labour Corps, I am directed by the Minister of Pensions to acquaint you for the information of the Secretary of State, that the medical authorities of this Department assess the degree of this officer's disablement at 40% for a period of six months.

Had Captain McCrae's case been one for the disposal of this Department, he would, therefore, have been awarded temporary retired pay at the rate of £70 a year, from the 1st January, 1919, to the 30th June, 1919, and informed that he might then apply for further medical examination.

In reply to your letter (56354/1918) re Captain D. McCrae he was examined on Aug. 22 and as he then had had two attacks of blackwater fever. He also had a then quiescent tuberculosis. No sufficient recovery is possible for him to be fit for any form of service in Tropical Africa.

I have the honour to report that I have this day examined Captain D. McCrae, East Africa M.L.C. and he has had two attacks of blackwater fever. He has old now latent phthisis. In my opinion he is unfit for further military service in East Africa, or in most tropical places.

PROCEEDING OF A MEDICAL BOARD ASSEMBLED AT BRITISH GENERAL HOSPITAL NAIROBI ON 22ND FEBRUARY 1918, BY ORDER OF A.D.M.S. L OF C, No. BI/243/M dated 22/2/18 for the purpose of examining and reporting on the present state of health of Captain D. McCrae, M.L.D.

The Board having assembled pursuant to order proceed to examine the above named and find that this Officer is suffering from Chronic Malaria of the Subtertian Type. He has two severe attacks of Blackwater fever during the past 9 months the latest attack in January 1918. The Board recommend that he be invalided to England to proceed by Hospital Ship.

The opinion of the Board upon the questions hereinafter is as follows:

- (A). Is he fit for General Service? No.
- (B). If not fit, how long is he likely to be unfit? 6 months.
- (C). If not fit for General Service is he fit for light duty? No.
- (A). If not fit for General Service at home, is he fit for service at home? No.
- (B). If not so fit, how long is he likely to be unfit for service at home? 6 months.
- Was the disability contracted by Military Service? Yes.
- Was it contracted under circumstances over which he had no control? Yes.
- Was it refused by Military Service. Yes.

If caused by Military Service to what specific conditions is it attributed? Active Service in tropics.

If the injury has resulted in the loss of limbs or eyes, such losses should be specified. Not applicable.
