

Sir,
Herewith I have the honour to inform you that I have placed a list of the details which I consider necessary for sinking shallow shafts before the known diggers, have seen before the manufacturers and returned the Registration List of the known diggers.

for the proper working of this outfit, I would suggest a foreman [redacted] accustomed to working shafts under similar conditions. I understand that a man may be obtained from the Sudan, an arrangement which I think would be highly satisfactory. About the labourers would be required, if possible the charge of a Headman who has had some experience in the Department of Public Works and is capable of taking charge of the work for a few years.

3. If possible, I would strongly advise the use of a Scotch cart for transporting the material as land transport necessitates cutting up materials and more rope into lengths and splicing again. The

old traps must be the only available means. No head traps will be required. The labourers about 15⁰ men will be required. The labourers waited for the work of sinking canals, of course, to draw from them.

4. I would request permission to obtain a small thermometer (13/6), a rain-gauge (5/6) and a pair for measuring evaporation. With these some useful data would be obtained.
