a Probationary Officer in the Customs Department of the East Africa Protectorate (Sudan).

with salary at the rate of £150 a year rising by annual increments of £10 to £250 a year. A temporary war bonus <sup>is also payable in 2.5 p.c. is</sup> the rate of bonus which corresponds to a salary of £150, is £58 for a married officer and £35 for an unmarried officer. Quarters are provided free of rent (but not of rates or similar outgoings) or an allowance in lieu of ~~the same~~ and clerks' charges.

Regulations showing the general conditions attached to appointments in the Protectorate and the Law and practice relating to such officers are enclosed herewith, but you are to understand that you will be subject to any regulations which may hereafter be introduced by the Secretary of State. Your attention is invited to the provisions of the Regulations relating to the provision of local transport facilities. A copy of the regulations as to pensions and a copy of the Colonial Regulations are also enclosed.

3. If you are prepared to accept the appointment on these conditions, you should present yourself to one of the medical advisers of this Department whose names are given on the enclosed letter, for the purpose of being medically examined. The letter is to be left with him and you will be required to pay him a fee of ~~one guinea~~ and will send his report direct to this Department. The fee of one guinea for the examination will be paid by the Govt.
